Higher education policy, entrepreneurship and innovation

2022 **European Strategy for Universities:**

- 100.000 Erasmus+ traineeships every year, including in SMEs and start-ups
- Set-up of student incubators and living labs in universities
- Support the future-proof skills development and entrepreneurship competences of graduates and co-design of curricula between industry
- The launch of a European framework of micro-credentials for lifelong learning and employability,

Synergies between Erasmus+ and Erasmus for Young Entrepreneurs (EYE) supporting entrepreneurship mobility




Erasmus+ higher education mobility



Past Erasmus+ programme achievements: higher education mobility 2014-2020 (KA103)

- Calls 2014-2020: approx. 2 200 000 student mobilities & 400 000 staff mobilities
- Strong average student grant increase over 5 years: +30%



Most call 2020 projects still ongoing, many call 2019 not yet closed.

Erasmus+ higher education mobility – priorities in higher education

- **1. Inclusion & diversity: Inclusive** mobility for persons from diverse backgrounds higher grants and more flexible mobility formats
- 2. **Digital transition: Blended** mobility (physical stays + virtual collaboration) and blended intensive programmes
- 3. Green transition: Greener, more sustainable mobility is financially encouraged
- 4. Participation in democratic life, common values and civic engagement
- **5. International dimension: Worldwide** mobility all students and staff, all countries
- **6. Bridge to research: Doctoral** short-term student and staff mobility and long-term student mobility complementing Marie Sklodowska-Curie Actions






KA131 – contracted projects and participants








Student Mobility for Studies and Traineeships in KA131 (Call 2022)

Traineeships and mobility consortia

- Erasmus+ higher education **traineeships**:
 - 1 million+ traineeship mobilities (calls 2007-2022)
 - **95**.4% **positive** general satisfaction (calls 2014-2020)
- Mobility consortia:
 - **231** accredited mobility consortia (KA130 accreditation) under call 2021 and 2022
 - FR 59, TR 53, ES 42, PT 22, IT 20, DE 11 consortia total **17** countries
 - Call 2022: 170 KA131 mobility consortium projects 18 800 contracted participants / 12 000 traineeships
 - Call 2022: 5 KA171 mobility consortium projects 326 contracted participants



KA131 Final Report - Assessment Criteria (call 2021-)

- Implementation performance (50 points)
 - Mobility activities (incl. mobility by mobility consortia)
 - Blended intensive programmes
- Accreditation compliance and quality (35 points)
 - ECHE accreditation compliance and quality of activities/outcomes; overarching priorities
 - Mobility consortium accreditation
- **Follow-up** (15 points)
 - Impact
 - Sharing of the project results








Digital Transition: Blended Mobility

Blended mobility implementation guide

- Blended mobility implementation guide for Erasmus+ higher education mobility KA131
- Published in October 2022
- Purpose: clarify what blended mobility is within Erasmus+ higher education and how it can be used effectively by higher education institutions
- Meant to give staff at higher education institutions an insight into what blended mobility in Erasmus+ is
 - Not just staff in international offices but also academic staff

Grant levels call 2023 - inflation

- Call 2023 adjustment to individual support base grant ranges due to inflation (+12%)
 - This allowed NAs to raise the grant level of the individual support base grant for students

Examples (at European level – Erasmus+ programme guide 2023):

- Short-term physical mobility:
 - 70 EUR -> 79 EUR
 - 50 EUR -> 56 EUR
- Medium range grant for long-term physical mobility:
 - 260-540 -> 292-606 EUR
- High range grant for long-term physical mobility:
 - 310-600 -> 348-674 EUR
- Call 2024: grant level study to look into all unit cost items
